Background and program

On Sunday 18 September, civil society, led by the self-organized Action Committee¹, will hold an open meeting to discuss advocacy at and after the United Nations (UN) Summit for Refugees and Migrants taking place on 19 September 2016.

Quoting from a dedicated UN website, the Summit is meant to be "a watershed moment to strengthen governance of international migration and a unique opportunity for creating a more responsible, predictable system for responding to large movements of refugees and migrants". At the Summit, heads of state and government leaders are set to adopt, by consensus, the Outcome document on which UN Member States reached consensus in 2 August, after months of intense negotiation.

The Outcome document is now called the "<u>New York Declaration for Refugees and Migrants</u>". The New York Declaration presents a set of principles and commitments for refugees and migrants, as well as two appendices, respectively called I. *Comprehensive refugee response framework*; and II. *Towards a global compact for safe, orderly and regular migration*.

The Declaration has received mixed reviews, overall but also in relation to specific parts of the document. For many, the "real and immediate test is whether the Summit will be able to make a difference on the ground for the millions of refugees, migrants and internally displaced people

¹ In May 2016, a global, <u>self-organized civil society Action Committee</u> was created to focus on action, outcomes and implementation of the UN General Assembly high-level Summit on Addressing Large Movements of Refugees and Migrants. Coconvened by ICMC, ICVA and the NGO Committee on Migration (New York), the Action Committee is comprised of NGOs with longstanding expertise and experience on refugee, migrant, forced displacement and human rights issues. (IDPs) in need of protection, safe passage, solidarity, inclusion, decent work and livelihoods, and for the societies that host them."²

Taking place in New York as heads of state and government leaders arrive for the Summit the following day, this meeting will be an informal space for civil society organizations to discuss these questions:

- 1. What is your reaction to the New York declaration? What's good about it, what's bad and what is missing?
- 2. What is the way forward for the Global Compact on Refugees? For the Global Compact on safe, orderly and regular migration? For the campaign(s) and policies against xenophobia and for inclusion?
- 3. How do we hold governments to commit and to account, and what civil society action and follow-up is needed: in the first 100-days? In the 6 months after?
- 4. What are <u>you</u> and your organization planning to do, for change on the ground, and how can civil society work together nationally and globally to achieve such change?
- 5. What are the most important messages for civil society to convey in advocacy and media work today and tomorrow, including within the program of tomorrow's Summit?

The meeting will be organized in plenary and three smaller group sessions (see program below). Each group session will be animated by one moderator and a few discussion starters, with a focus on interaction among the whole group. A rapporteur will then report back to the plenary on the five questions above.
